# MEET RYAN MULLINS – HE'S A PHILANTHROPIST

t was while sitting at a table with a group of friends that the question was first raised...."how do we pay tribute to Chris?" Chris Mansey was the friend they had just laid to rest at the all too young age of 30. The original idea was to establish a fund to raise money to buy a park bench to place close to Lake Ontario. But because of his love for family and friends, another idea was suggested. Why not have a golf tournament to bring together his love for the game of golf with that of his love for family and friends and support the hospital as an expression of appreciation for Chris' care?

And this is where Ryan Mullins enters the story. Ryan and Chris met while attending high school at C.D.C.I. East in Cobourg and soon after became fast friends. Even after graduation they stayed in touch and

would get together over a game of golf, or to go rollerblading, or to just hang out. Family and friends were devastated when Chris was diagnosed with colon cancer at the age of 26. Throughout his illness and during the final months of his life, Ryan stood by his friend and this involved daily visits to the Palliative Care Unit at Northumberland Hills Hospital where Chris was a patient.

Ryan tells me that he has a reputation for being "an organizer" so it was only natural that he would lead the charge in organizing the first-ever Chris Mansey Memorial Golf Tournament. The inaugural event on August 31st, 2008 was held – quite fittingly - on the one year anniversary of Chris' death. Proceeds in the amount of \$5,000 were donated to the NHH Foundation to support the care of palliative patients. When Chris' brother-in-law Mack arranged for two tickets anywhere WestJet flies to be added to the tournament as a raffle item, the event grew even bigger and raised even more money.

This past August, the 5th annual event took place bringing the cumulative total to an astounding \$60,000. Without Ryan's leadership, this simply would not have happened. Ryan, a Correctional Officer for Central East Corrections, and the father of two young children, Braxton 5, and Skyla 2 is an inspiration. And he doesn't just volunteer for the hospital. Ryan's coached for 12 years with the Cobourg Community Hockey League and he's also volunteered with the lacrosse league.

# 100@\$100/MONTH CHALLENGE – COULD THIS BE YOU?

arlier this month, Rick Gadd, Chair of the *Caring for Generations*Society, was pleased to announce details of an expanded monthly giving program that has a goal of celebrating 100 donors who donate \$100/month to the Foundation.

This program builds on the already highly successful *Caring for Generations Society* (the *Society*). First launched in 2002, the *Society* encourages people to consider an annual gift to the hospital of \$1,000. Monthly this breaks down to \$83.33 and many people have taken advantage of being able to spread a large gift over several months.

A new spin on the program has just been announced whereby we are looking for donors who are willing to give \$100 each month for a total annual gift of \$1,200.

Former Foundation Board member Anne Cross

was quick to respond by increasing her monthly gift. "We were happy to increase our monthly support," says Anne. We understand that, like most other things, medical equipment costs have increased so we felt it was time to increase our support as well."

"An annual gift of \$1,200 is significant and we recognize that it's something that not everyone will be able to do," says Gadd. "But we're hopeful that there might be 100 families out there in the County that can. To date, we've had some early success and we now have 18 donors who have accepted the challenge."

Membership does have its privileges and 100/\$100 monthly donors will receive invitations to attend special Hospital and Foundation events including an appreciation reception and Behind the Scenes Tours of the Hospital.

Robert Anglin of Port Hope, is also a retiree from IBM. He spent the majority of his career – 35 years - working mainly in the area of marketing. During his career he had

Each year both John and Robert faithfully complete the required paperwork and submit for a 50% match of their total annual donations (IBM matches 100% for active employees and 50% for retirees).



"Giftit is "Kijiji" with a twist," he said. If a person has, for instance, a set of chairs they no longer need, the idea is they can put them up for sale on Giftit but make sure the proceeds of any sale instantly go to the charity of their choosing. And, of course, they receive a donation receipt in return."

The NHH Foundation, which signed on early as part of a pilot group, enjoyed quick success with a donation of over \$3,600 through a sale of a couple of go-karts that were posted by Maxwell and David Stewart. "We weren't using the karts anymore as we grew out of them," explains Max Stewart, so we thought let's see if we can use **Giftit** to not only find a good home, but a good cause for the money."

The proud new owner of these go-karts is Chris McGregor of Whitby who bought them for him and his son Jackson to enjoy. "It feels great. **Giftit** was easy to use and the fact my money actually went to NHH Foundation is even better, " explains Chris.
